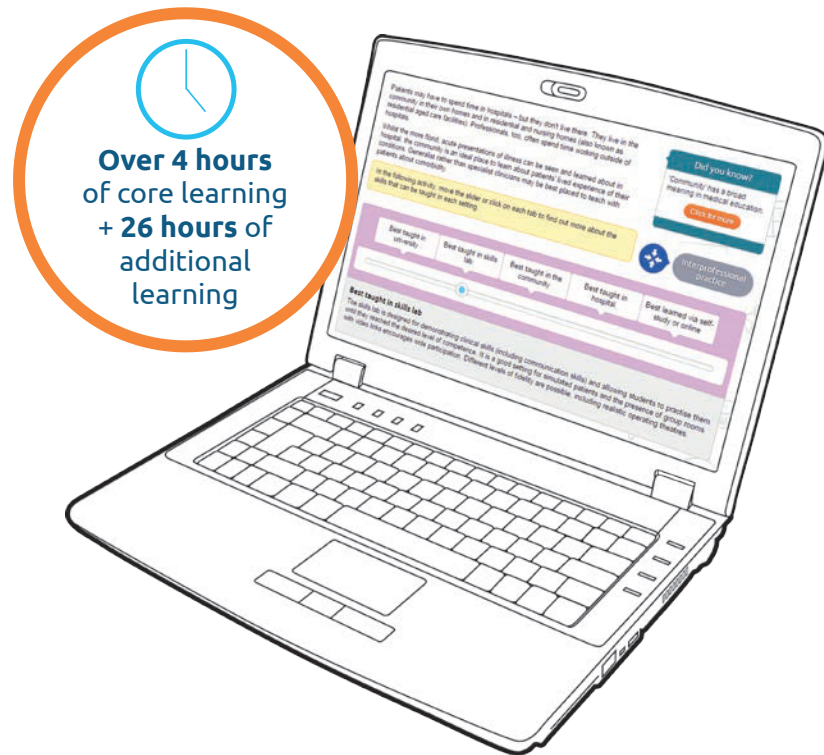


Enhance the quality of clinical education

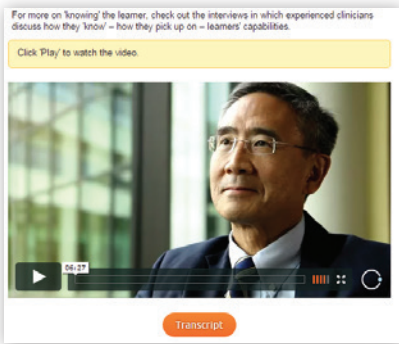
